"I paint, after thinking" is my motto.












Inagination Gone

Through its dynamic and evocative visuals, the artwork effectively captures the artist's state of mind during the creative process, which gave rise to the title "Imagination Gone Wild."








Australia


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Digital Painting and Drawing








Digital Painting and Drawing






Parasympathetic and Sympathetic Nervous System Fighting



After being passionately interested in art as a consumer for as long as I can remember, I decided several years ago to quit working as a teacher and to devote myself full-time to producing my own paintings and drawings. I was fortunate enough to be able to get one-on-one tuition with artist and teacher Alexander Damien in his Manchester studio, starting with tuition in drawing and subsequently moving onto painting with oils on canvas. I had been a keen amateur photographer for some time and was able to use my own photographs as the starting point for my artwork in many cases, something that I continue to do to this day. After completing my studies with Alexander, I joined the Windmill Art Group where I found the discussions and exchange of ideas with local artists to be very helpful to my artistic development.

Under the auspices of the art group I contributed works to many local exhibitions in various art centres in my locality, and in March 2014 my drawing "Tommy" was short-listed for the summer exhibition at The Royal Academy. I also had a drawing accepted into a competitive open exhibition at the Atkinson Art Gallery in Southport, and a painting into one at the Grundy Art Gallery in Blackpool, both of these being old established municipal art galleries.

Since moving to Scotland I have joined a local painters' group and been inspired to paint several local landscape scenes, particularly of the impressive coast near to my place of residence. I also have applied myself to the sights of California, where I have family and have travelled around extensively. The human figure is a favourite subject, too, both in terms of portraits and people in landscapes.

In April 2015 I was told that my entry for the BBC Little Painting Challenge had been selected from over 29000 submissions to be included in a national exhibition at the Whitworth Art Gallery in Manchester, which was held in May 2015. I have also had my paintings Still Life with Bread, Fruit and Wine and Lost in Thought featured in Paint magazine, the national publication for the Society for All Artists.


In January 2017 my painting, "Beach Scene, Coronado, San Diego", was awarded a prize in the Garstang Open Art Exhibition and in April 2018 my painting "Portrait of a Boy" won a prize under the Duchess of Hamilton Award Scheme. My artistic influences include Hockney, Warhol, Lowry and Van Gogh.





My work focuses on loose, expressive brushwork and vivid colors to create an aesthetic of painting. The paintings have images of relics such as statues, ruins, antiquated architecture, vases, and fountains placed within a garden to enforce the concept of tranquility, history, the passage of time, and mortality. The gardens are mostly imagined and idealized, although initially based on a reference, embellished into a sketch, and then a painting is based off the imagined / idealized sketch. I create scenes which can express intimate and isolated moments, meaning to

be therapeutic and meditative. The fragility of life and civilization becomes a recurring theme in my work reflected in the interaction of nature with historical markers and relics.

Biography: Michael Athanasius Hanna grew up and spent many years in Jersey City, New Jersey and has been drawing and painting since the age of eight. While growing up in the city, one of Michael's favorite activities as a child was weekly trips to Liberty State Park and Bayonne Park where he would fly kites, ride his bike, skateboard, and fish. Fascinated by the nature surrounding the parks as well as the historical markers, sundial, and statues he encountered. In his early work he was inspired by the works of Peter Paul Rubens because of composition and anatomy.

As he developed, Michael found inspiration in the colors and brushwork of Pierre-Auguste Renoir. The work focuses on the mark in fine art, believing the application of the tool by the artist as the most vital aspect of painting and drawing. He sustains a loose and vibrant application of his tool, by using nature as his subject, specifically gardens with historical relics / historical markers, allows him to shape organic compositions and lines through foliage, bark, water, and stone.



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
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
