RAFFI YEDALIAN


Born in Beirut in 1973, Yedalian is a Lebanese-Armenian painter and sculptor. He is a member of the Lebanese Artists Association of Painters and Sculptors and a member of the Artists Union of Armenia. He has held different solo and group exhibitions.

His work has been showcased in: Volta Basel (Switzerland), Moderne Art (France), Art 15 London (UK), XIIth Florence Biennale (Italy), Red Dot Miami (USA), Beirut Art Fair (Lebanon), Contemporary Art Platform CAP (Kuwait), Art Week Dubai (UAE), International Print Festival Life N Style (Georgia). In 2015, Yedalian presented to H.H. Pope Francis his painting of Blessed Ignatius Maloyan, in St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican, and this painting has been reproduced and issued by the Philatelic and Numismatic Office of Vatican City Authorities in a Limited Edition Stamp on September 2, 2015. In 2012, "Meghabard", his bronze monument, was inaugurated and blessed by H.H. Pope Benedict XVI during his visit to Our Lady of Bzommar, Lebanon.

A miniature replica of the monument is part of H.H. Pope Benedict XVI's collection in Vatican City. Some of the artist's works are on view in permanent collections including: Sursock Museum (Lebanon), Vatican City (Rome), Modern and Contemporary Art Museum "MACAM" (Lebanon), Modern Art Museum of Yerevan (Armenia), Museum of the Shrine of Fatima (Portugal), Museum of The Armenian Genocide (Armenia), Ministry of Culture (Lebanon), Museum of the Convent of Our Lady Bzommar (Lebanon), Museum of the Great House of Cilicia (Lebanon), and many more throughout the world. Her 2nd study after finishing art history at the "Universidad Complutense" in Madrid. In the year of her graduation (1993) she was nominated for the Academy Prize. A year later, in 1994, she was named "Talent of the Year" in Amsterdam. In Pulchri Studio in The Hague she received the honorary prize of the "Javaanse Jongens Graphic Award". This was followed by beautiful publications in leading magazines such as "Art View" and "Blad". And numerous exhibitions in the Netherlands and abroad

Angeles draws with thread. In her own characteristic style she creates sculptures from drawings. 

She was a member of the Künstlerhaus Vienna in 1996 and graduated from the Masaryk Academy of Art, Prague.

She lives and works in Berlin and Ticino (Switzerland)

THE BEAUTIFUL MYSTERIOUSNESS

In what resembles a diabolic provocation, Eliška Bartek's fascinating photographs of orchids, hibiscus and magnolia blossoms seem illuminated by Bengal lights. They appear to be twisted together from angels' wings. Most important for the artist in her work with fresh flowers is the use of artificial light which provides a larger spectrum than sunlight and makes the specific objects glow three dimensionally on a stage setting. The artist relies completely on the analogue character of conventional photography and rejects the aid of computers.

Most of the flowers originated from a botanical garden in a small village in the district of Ticino, which lies in the Italian part of Switzerland. Eliška made her selection following strict artistic criteria: only the most sculptural looking specimens were cut for her by the owner himself. The fascinatingly lit images invite us to close-up investigation but also suggest distant panorama perspective, thus providing romanticism as well as its critique.

The powerful interaction between the botanical and the artificial invokes exoticism and eroticism, beauty and danger. Nature is always one step ahead of culture - but these flowers are more: they are horribly beautiful, dangerous, melancholic and romantic. These works tell the tale of Eliška Bartek's little garden of paradise, an eternally flowering place of delight.

Gela Mikava's abstract art is characterized by distinctive shapes, vibrant colors, and expressive textures. He is most recognized for her work in painting, video, photography, installation, and sculpture. Her artwork often explores social and political issues, such as gender equality, civil rights, and the displacement of people. He has had her artwork included in numerous solo and group exhibitions and biennials worldwide, including in prestigious venues such as the Museum of Modern Art and the Venice Biennale.

Her work has also been featured in several magazines, including Artforum and Art In America.







MASTERFUL CARVERS OF RAJASTHAN

Working almost exclusively in rare sandalwoods, Rohit Jangid hand-sculpt elaborate art that has earned awards from Records books and the government of India.


Rohit begin each carving day at 9am and work until 8pm, breaking only for lunch. Learning to sculpt with precision and exactness on a miniature scale that challenges even the most seasoned carvers, the family looks upon their craft as a lifelong journey—not as work so much as a calling, a mission in life and a pathway to personal and family fulfilment. As a result, they are at their tasks almost 365 days a year.

Rohit notes, "This is our traditional work, and we are addicted and dedicated to it. This is a kind of worship for us. Also, it is the family's only way to gain money. No other money-making job is allowed to distract us." A collection of the simple tools used for the intricate carvings, all done by hand. Using the simplest tools, Rohit faithfully adhere to their forefathers' style, a loyalty that keeps the tradition of miniature carving alive for at least one more generation. "We make most of our own tools, according to our needs," Rohit tells us—"small iron sticks, knives, chisels and tools for filing."

Finding fresh projects is part of the drill—new items to carve, new designs and new clients. They use old books and the Internet to explore what others have produced and build their ideas creatively from the photos. They draw inspiration for their miniaturised carvings from history, mythology and day-today life in India. Their highly intricate designs are created by using a combination of carving methods, such as deep carving, shallow carving, latticework and fretwork on a nearly impossible miniature scale.

















My name is Venus Behjati, I was born in Qazvin, Iran in 1988 and currently based in Derby, United Kingdom.


